

# Concurrent Enrollment

Concurrent enrollment serves eligible Minnesota public high school students in grades 11 and 12\*, who are enrolled in a postsecondary course taught during the regular school day and offered through a partnership between a high school and a college or university.

\*Students in grades 9 and 10 can participate if district and postsecondary agree to enrollment, or the course is a world language course available to 11th and 12th grade students.



Qualified high school instructors or college faculty teach the concurrent courses. The courses are the same courses offered at a college or university.



High school students earn both high school and transcribed college credit. Both high school and colleges students are held to the same academic standards.



High school teachers must be approved by the partnering college/university and meet the institution's academic requirements.

College faculty teaching concurrent courses must meet same credentials and qualifications required to teach college/university courses.



State reimbursement provides funding to districts to help defray the cost of offering concurrent courses in high schools. There is no cost to the student to participate in these courses.
